Using the Elluminate Collaborate Webinar Software

Requirement - Windows

- Windows XP (32 bit), Windows Vista (32 or 64 bit) or Windows 7 (32 or 64 bit)
- Pentium III 1 GHz processor

Requirement - Mac OS X

- Mac OS X 10.5 (32 or 64 bit) or Mac OS X 10.6 (32 or 64 bit)
- G4, G5 or Intel processor

Requirement - Linux - Ubuntu 9.10 (64 bit)

Also:

- Java version 1.5 or higher
- 256 MB RAM
- 20 MB free disk space
- 28.8 Kbps connection (the more the better and no wireless is best)
- Windows or Linux: sound card with headset
- Macs: internal, USB, or external iSight microphone

Ensure your pop up blockers are off and you can run Java. If you have a firewall, you may have to change the Proxy Settings preference in Blackboard Collaborate. If Blackboard Collaborate encounters a proxy configuration error, it will return a Connection failed error message. Ask your System Administrator for help or to provide you with the necessary proxy server information.
